For the Honors Bachelor Degree (Four-Year), a Honors Specialization **or** a Double Major is essential. Each Major Module is normally 6.0 - 7.0 senior courses specified by the department. For admission to the Major Modules, you must complete 3.0 first year principal courses specified by the department with an average of 70% and no mark less than 60%. For progression in Honors, a 70% cumulative modular average is required in each Major, with no mark below 60%. A passing grade is required in each option.
